Types of Honey

Honey types are determined based on the production area, color, aroma, flower nectar type, and extraction time, among other factors.

The difference in honey colors is due to the varying colors of flower nectar. For example, acacia honey is white, thyme honey is red, Astragalus honey is yellow, and forty-flower honey is dark.

Top Honey Exporters Worldwide

The global honey market was valued at around three billion dollars in 2022. China, New Zealand, India, Argentina, and Germany are the top five honey-exporting countries, with their export volumes detailed as follows:

Although Iran is the third-largest honey producer globally, it is not among the major exporters. However, the data indicates that the world has significant potential for honey exports. Looking at the global trade balance, the negative figure in the trade balance shows that global honey imports are about 69 billion dollars higher than exports.

Export Statistics

China, New Zealand, and India are the top three honey-exporting countries globally, while the United States, Germany, and Japan are the largest honey importers.

According to data from the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO), the production of honey in Iran in 2021 amounted to approximately 77,000 tons.

A closer look at the trade balance of honey-importing countries reveals that all of them export more than they import. Particularly, Germany often acts as a re-exporter for many products, meaning that after importing bulk products, it repackages and adds value before exporting the same products to other European countries.

A detailed examination of Trade Map statistics shows that New Zealand, Argentina, and India, with positive trade balances, are true consumers of imported honey. Among these three countries, New Zealand has experienced the most significant growth in honey imports, with an increase of 21% over the past year (2018-2022).

However, if we consider the highest growth in global honey imports, Venezuela, Chile, Zimbabwe, and Nigeria have shown growth exceeding 200%.





Honey Derivatives

Besides honey, by-products and related products, such as beeswax, royal jelly, and pollen, are also exported to other countries as valuable and profitable products.
